How to make an interactive map using Google Fusion Tables

Google fusion tables are easy. Everything you could ever know about fusion tables, you can learn by googling.

Here's a quick guide to get you started.

County populations map:

- 1. Go to your google drive, install fusion tables app
- 2. Open http://bit.ly/countyboundaries
- 3. File → merge on the populations table, paste in the boundaries table URL
- 4. Feature map → change feature style → polygons → fill color → add gradient to map → use the range it provides
- 5. Feature map \rightarrow change info window \rightarrow uncheck everything you don't want to show up
- 6. Tools \rightarrow publish, embed HTML

How to make your own shapefiles:

- 1. Get .zip files from a trusted source. The DNR has a lot here: http://dnr.wi.gov/maps/gis/metadata.html
- 2. Go to http://shpescape.com/
- 3. Choose the "Google Fusion Table" option
- 4. Upload the .zip file
- 5. Wait for shape escape to process your data
- 6. Open the fusion table it gives you...then merge it with whatever you want
